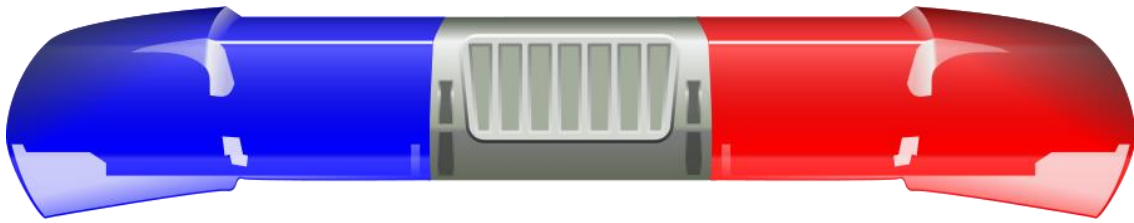

Civic Addressing

In December 2012, in our Volume 1 Issue 2 Newsletter, we told you about the need for a civic address. Back in our 2012 Newsletter we stated that *“We have made several trips within the municipality ensuring every property; every door will get a street address. Once everything is complete we will be mailing notices out informing people of their new civic address. It is important that once this is done that people take the time to put up their new address so it is clear and visible from the street.”* That work was completed. Now it is your turn!

EPS has attended to over 250 properties where the civic address has not been posted, or are not clearly visible. Council has given clear direction to EPS to work with the community in getting these addresses up. Your address needs to be visible for service providers, emergency response, family and visitors to know where they are going. Thank you to those who have posted their address!

Who do I call??

Periodically there are questions on who to call when there is a question or problem. Here is some information to assist with that. These are examples we have received from the past year;

- A tree fell across a road – for any hazards or obstructions for all municipal roads and property call the District of Lakeland Administration Office 306-982-2010
- Parking – all parking and road obstruction complaints should be directed to EPS. Parking violations taking place on all highways (roads) may be directed to us.
- Impaired Driver – Pull over and call 9-1-1.
- What is my civic address? – Please call the Administration Office to confirm your civic address (your civic address is also on assessment notices, tax notices and receipts)
- Can I burn my leaves? – Burning is regulated by the municipality and the province. Please call EPS prior to doing any controlled burning for your authorizations.
- Do I need a permit to cut a tree? If the tree is on your property call Planning and Development or the Administration Office. If the tree is on public property call the Administration Office.
- I have a power outage – you can report it to SaskPower at 310-2220

The District of Lakeland is always working to ensure that if a public emergency event takes place here, we are able to notify you. In recent years plow winds/tornados, severe snow storms, and forest fires have had an effect on the municipality. We have taken steps to ensure those wanting to be notified, will be.

The District of Lakeland has partnered with Emergency Communications Network to use their system CODE RED.

We are working to build and launch this mass emergency notification system in 2016. We will update our website as information is ready for release. Enrollment will be through our website and will be quick and easy. Just click the link and register yourself, your kids, or your family. Enrollment is quick and free.

Snow Dump

As winter is here, and the snow will be more abundant in the coming months we want to remind people that the District of Lakeland will again be offering free snow dump areas. Snow dumps will be open to people that remove snow from their property within Lakeland. Snow dump is for uncontaminated snow. The snow dumps are located at;

- Overflow parking lot on Bell's Beach Access/Lutheran Road near the recycle bins
- The Landfill

The snow dump is for private residential property owners from the municipality. We ask that you do not push or pile snow on public property or roads. Questions on the snow dump? Call the Administration Office 306-982-2010.

Garbage Containers

Periodically EPS is notified about garbage containers that are left out on road right away that are in the way of road work. We also get calls regarding garbage scattered around collection bins as birds and small animals have broken into them. Garbage containers must be stored on your property unless it is within 24 hours of the prescribed collection time. To further assist people the District of Lakeland has placed animal resistant bins at Sunnyside, Murray Point, Ambrose Lane, Bell's Beach and Anglin Lake for regular household waste collection. Please do your part in keeping your collection bin pulled up into your property and ensure the area is clean of any garbage that may have been scattered about.
